


St. Mary Arabic School prides itself on the quality of its educational programs, the professionalism of the staff, the enthusiasm of the students to learn another language, and the high level of support provided by parents and volunteers. This program's goal focuses on teaching our students how to read and write the Arabic language in a high moral and faith-based environment. Additionally, there is emphasis on learning and understanding the complexity of Arabic grammar. We accomplish these goals by continuously updating the two books we supply our students. We also encourage our students to practice proper and respectful attitudes while incorporating good morals.

With the help of our hard working teachers and assistant volunteers, Lina has been directing and teaching at St. Mary's Arabic School since 2007. St. Mary's Arabic School currently serves almost 100 students (ages 4 and up) and continues to grow in size. This program includes 20 sessions starting in October and ending in March. 
## Journey Through the Bible (English Bible Study)





#### Camp St. Mary (This report was prepared by 2022 CSM Director, Luke Shaheen)



## **Holy Land Trip**

About 22 parishioners were blessed to take a Holy Land Pilgrimage in September, led by Father Jim, and arranged by Good Shepherd Travel. During the ten day trip, pilgrims visited biblical sites all around the Holy Land, including major attractions like the Church of the Holy Sepulcher in Jerusalem and the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem, as well as Jacob's Well, the Sea of Galilee, the Apostles Church, and many, many more. The group met with other Orthodox groups, led by Fr. Constantine Naser, of Oklahoma City, a frequent visitor to the Holy Land, Fr. Nicholas Dahdal of Chicago, and Fr. David Lewis of Texas. This allowed them to experience the Holy Land with fellow Orthodox brothers and sisters, in true fellowship as they watched the gospel come to life. Good Shepherd is arranging another tour to Greece in July so that we may, "Follow in the Footsteps of St. Paul." Glory to God for this amazing opportunity!











#### **Ladies Society**

The Basilica of St. Mary Ladies Society held several events including a Bingo Night in October, which was a fellowship event that raised \$2,000 from raffle ticket sales. They also held their annual Christmas Potluck and Bazaar in December, which raised \$2,100 in Kroger and Meijer gift cards for the needy. They worked with the Men's Fellowship and FOCUS Detroit to sponsor Christmas gifts for 75 children from underserved communities, which was highly successful. All the children were sponsored within one day! They also chaired the Time Capsule project, which is still in progress. The Ladies Society will contribute a photograph of all the Ladies Society presidents of the past 20 years, taken with Fr. George and Kh. Nouhad Shalhoub. The photo includes an icon of the Theotokos and the Antiochian Women's Prayer. They decorated the Christmas trees in December and planned to bring back the Wine Tasting for 2023. They will present the Parish Council with \$5,000, which leaves them with an end of year balance of \$2,380.

At the Basilica of Saint Mary Montessori Academy (BOSMMA), we strive to provide an education that nurtures the whole child - mind, body, and soul. Our Montessori method emphasizes a child-centered approach, hands-on learning, multi-age classrooms, and an emphasis on independence, self-motivation, and social skills.

We currently have an enrollment of 65 students and are actively involved in community engagement through activities such as food drives (November), sock drives (December), blessing bags (February), and St. Jude Trike-a-Thon (May). Our summer camp programs include fun themes for children ages 3-12 and a one-week nationally certified STEM program (Science/Technology/Engineering/Math) for grades K-6th. All of this is done in a culturally diverse, nurturing, and engaging environment that is infused with an Orthodox faith-based approach.

Our recent achievement includes the completion of the kitchen remodel project. This project has greatly

improved our ability to provide nutritious meals for our students and staff, as well as creating a more welcoming and functional space for our staff and the church parishioners. 



#### **Vacation Church School**
