

Our website performed exceptionally well last year with 20,000 users visiting the site, with over 90% being new users. A majority visited from the United States but we also had users visit from the Netherlands, Canada, United Kingdom, and Germany. From the 20,000 users, there were 67,000 pageviews.

I've been directing and teaching at St. Mary Arabic School with the hard work of volunteer teachers and assistants since 2007. We reached 100 students this year, ages 4 and up. Our curriculum consists of 20 sessions from October through March and takes place every Sunday after Church School, from 12:30-1:30. We were able to provide our students with updated books this year that helped us teach them how to read and write the Arabic language while enhancing their understanding of the Arabic grammar. We also try teaching our students good morals and attitudes used in daily life. In addition we teach English as a second language (ESL class) for adults. Thank you so much to those who continuously supported us, especially Father George, Father Jim, Father Samer, Deacon Suhail, Deacon Osama, Stacey, Olive and Sonya. Additionally, we are grateful to those who donated to our program in hopes of supporting our children and maintaining our native language in our cultures. God bless our church!














Basilica Band (report prepared by Band Spiritual Adviser, Fr. Samer Hanna)

Daughters of St. Mary/ St. Paisios Arabic Bible Study Group



In 2023 the Men's Fellowship was proud to become an official ministry within the church and now has a seat on the Parish Council. The year kicked off with the group's first official fundraiser which was a successful and fun Valentines Day party, which helped raise money for the Church. Throughout the year we looked for ways to serve the church and the community. In April our fellowship sponsored and served lunch to the parish after one of the Holy Week Services. In November we met for our annual Friendsgiving where Father Jim gave a beautiful candle lit prayer for those suffering in the Middle East and around the world. Mission and Educational Philosophy: At the core of BOSMMA's mission is an unwavering commitment to nurturing the whole child - mind, body, and soul. Our Montessori approach centers around a child-centered philosophy, immersive hands-on learning experiences, vibrant multi-age classrooms, and the cultivation of independence,

self-motivation, and essential social skills. All of this is done in a culturally diverse, nurturing, and engaging environment that is infused with an Orthodox faith-based approach.

Academic Achievements: With an enrollment of 75 students, we proudly highlight academic accomplishments. This year, we're continuing our CGS Religious Education class, as well as introducing two new extracurricular classes- Dance, and Arabic. These classes give our students the opportunity to explore different areas of interest and assist in provoking curiosity to different subjects. Our school has also made improvements to the learning environment including energy-efficient lights, revamped



flooring, and painting in the activity center. Additionally, our commitment to safety and comfort is evident with the installation of two new furnace units and new fencing.

Service Projects and Community Engagement: BOSMMA remains actively engaged with the community through various service projects, including food drives, pajama drives, a cultural festival, blessing bags, and the St. Jude Trike-a-Thon. These initiatives not only benefit the community but also instill a sense of compassion and social responsibility in our students.

The Teen SOYO at the basilica of St. Mary continues to be one of our parish's most successful ministries.
